Brent Renaud, along with his brother Craig form the Renaud Brothers and together make documentaries about tough subjects from the Mexican drug war to wounded American soldiers. The latter is the topic of their film, Warrior Champions that screens March 15 during the ReelAbilities Film Festival. It tells the story of a group of seriously injured American soldiers who find healing through sports.

After fighting for their country in Iraq, Kortney Clemons, Scott Winkler, Mellssa Stockwell, and Carlos Leon compete in the 2008 Paralympic Games in Beljing. The film follows them as they learn to cope with their injuries and compete for a coveted spot on the US Paralympic team. It is an uplifting testament to the human spirit that challenges every notion of what it means to be disabled. The Renaud Brothers have won dozens of major awards including an Edward R. Murrow Award.
